

Geology Museum, Ipoh



On 11th of March 2016, a Geography excursion was held in Ipoh for the Year 8 and Year 9 students. A total of 69 students participated, and were accompanied by Ms. Suba, Ms. Surya, Mr. Asyraf, Mr. Syahbandi, and Mr. Anjum. The excursion began at 6.45 am and ended at 6.20 pm, lasting a whole day.

The objective of this educational excursion was for the students to learn about the different types of rocks in Malaysia. The students also learnt about rock formation and discovered geological findings in Malaysia. The excursion was organised to expose the students to different types of rocks, as this is covered in Topic 1 of the Year 9 Geography syllabus.



Throughout the trip, the students also discovered the physical geography of the state of Perak. They saw numerous limestone caves along the way. The students learnt about the types of rocks in Perak, and discovered how they were formed over thousands of years.

Apart from the geological part of the excursion, the students also got to visit the places of interest in Ipoh, and discovered the

fruits and other delicacies that were sold in the state. They also learned about the differences between Kuala Lumpur city and Ipoh town.

Differences in culture, tradition, and lifestyle were observed during the trip. The students experienced the serenity and tranquillity of Ipoh town, and more lush greenery, as compared to KL city. They were also able to discuss the difference in climate and landscape between the two places.



Throughout this trip, the students gained an incredible amount of knowledge about the different variety of rocks in Malaysia, as well as the physical geography of Ipoh, based on their findings during the excursion.
